2024 In Numbers

- 743 orienteering classes and events for 14,936 participants.
- 295 classes were run without NG staff, meeting our goal for teachers to run activities independently.
- 27 schools in MA experienced orienteering in classes (pre-K - 12).
- 19 workshops for educators in 6 states (ME, VT, NH, MA, CA, WV).
- 13 "Beginning to Orienteer" kits ordered from 8 states (MA, PA, NH, VT, CO, CA, FL, TN).
- 50 maps used; 16 new maps made.
- 55 volunteers donated more than 1,840 hrs, virtually and in-person.

2024 has been a really busy and productive year - our team grew (we ♥ our new Program Manager Mikayla) and we expanded to new places with new partners.

Our core focus remains unchanged - to give educators the tools to teach life skills to youth through outdoor navigation games and activities. Our vision is for every youngster to be confident at map navigation, while having fun outside.

2024 Highlights

- 450 third graders from 12 schools took part in a team navigation challenge to celebrate the completion of their orienteering unit in Cambridge, MA.
- 56 cadets competed on 5 courses at the NJROTC Orienteering Championships in Durham, NH. Thanks to orienteering clubs UNO & NEOC for their collaboration!
- Over 250 people explored our new maps of Georges and Peddocks Islands, thanks to a Boston Harbor Now innovation grant.
- Nearly 350 people signed up for our annual after-dark navigation game in October.
- Seeing how much fun pre-schoolers have with our games and learning about child development!

School Orienteering

Bring map navigation to your school! Our programs kick off with a hands-on professional development session for teachers. We adapt our curriculum to fit the grades and number of sessions. We can co-teach the first lessons with you and even organize field trips to the woods.

In 2024, we brought orienteering to thousands of students across multiple districts. In **Cambridge**, every 3rd grader learned orienteering as a part of the PE curriculum, we codeveloped a 2-week high school PE unit, and we taught navigation classes at all 5 upper schools. We supported after-school teams at the middle and high schools. In **Brookline**, we partnered with 6 schools to deliver PE units for elementary, middle and high school students. We ran programs in other schools (including **Lexington**Montessori, Medford Public Schools, British International School). Finally, we're staying connected with schools who can now teach orienteering independently of us.
